I initially wrote this article several months ago (and have since then, seen Jimmy Swaggart memes on Facebook that as memory serves were along these lines.). The new year seemed a good month to publish this article

I have thought for a while that we sometimes put people in a box. "She's the pretty one", "he's the black sheep", "She's a dumb blonde", "He's the nerd", "she's the promiscuous one", "he is the homeless guy who stands in front of Walmart", "she's a drunk" etc. I have been guilty of that too: "He's the one who worked on my Charger", "he's the gospel singer who cheated on his wife and wrecked his ministry", "he's the former comedian and baritone of the Gaither Vocal band who wrote the lyrics for 'Mary Did You Know'". Those descriptions can help identify a person to someone who knows that part of the person, but are not all inclusive as far as the totality of who they are, or what God sees in them (a valuable human being that He died for).

For instance, the last one (Mark Lowry) is often known for his maybe sometimes overboard humor, but there is more to him than that. J.D. Sumner once said that he hadn't liked Mark Lowry because of the way he acted with his humor, but later discovered how deeply spiritual Mark was when he got to know him). They became great friends after J.D. lost his wife. J.D. also mentioned Gloria Gaither and said he hated the poems she did and would think "here we go again" when she did them. But one time, she was asked to pray, and he said to himself that he had better listen to the prayer. He said she prayed the sweetest prayer he had ever heard in his life. He said she is profound and the reason there is a Bill Gaither was because of her (she wrote the lyrics to most of their songs). He grew to see beyond the poems and narrations, and said he didn't know of a lady he loved more than her. Sometimes getting to really know a person can surprise us and be a blessing.

Bryan Hutson talked about being warned years ago about a particular singer his group was about to work with, and said he tried avoiding that person on because of what he had been told. But the man was nice to him and over the course of working days together, Bryan never saw anything but nice from him.

Did the person who warned him, lie to Bryan? I can't say. Did the other person behave in the past like told to Bryan (however that was because Bryan never posted details)? I don't know. If so, was it a bad day or something that happened a long time ago? I have no idea. Sometimes we judge people on who they were a long time ago, what we have heard (which could be false, or based on an opinion which is not the same as we might have if we were there), one aspect of them while missing a lot of other things, lies, or an assessment from someone that may or may not have been accurate, or was then, but not now.

Here's a test. What's the first thing you first think of when you hear the name Jimmy Swaggart? Sadly, for me, I still probably think of the scandal from around 35 years ago. Not the good that he did before, or has apparently done since. I feel a degree of shame to still associate that as the main thing about him, but it's still probably normally the first thing that comes to mind. I am not saying humans can put sins in the sea of forgetfulness like God does. I am not saying we even **should** forget some things (for instance I think it is reckless to leave someone once convicted of sex crimes alone with those who might become victims of that person, even if we believe they have repented and are forgiven.) We can be cautiously optimistic about how they seem to have changed, without putting them in a situation that is risky for others, or maybe even a temptation to them. From what I know, Jimmy has had a successful ministry for a long time since that time 35 years ago, and I sort of know people who know him, speak highly of him. (One I believe being a pastor himself). If he has changed (and I hope he has) then praise God! I think about Paul. He did horrible things, but God transformed and used him. But as a human, I can understand people being wary about him and afraid he was going to kill them or betray them. On the plus side, there are people I know in real life that I don't define (or even usually even think of) things from their pasts. I haven't entirely forgotten, but those things are in their long distant past, and there has been enough time that I believe they will not happen again.

The good news is our past can be forgiven, we aren't destined to be just one thing or to be what we currently are forever (God can change us). It is my hope that we get better at not judging a book by its cover, and try to get to know people (even if they are different than us, or have a "past"). May we all see with eyes of grace and love and try to see them as God sees them.


