

A Note from Terry Snyder

I saw a quote in passing that said that **churches have made programs to make people comfortable and it easier to "worship" God, but in reality worshiping isn't easy,** it is a sacrifice. It is singing a song we may not like (I would clarify providing the lyrics are sound), it is worshiping and praising God even if it's been one of those mornings, it means allowing kids to see how the adults worship during the service rather than letting them go to other things), it is serving and loving people even when we don't feel like it, it is us sacrificing our wants to serve others. **Many of us in America do not like sacrificing**. To us, a sacrifice may be getting a smaller drink or French fry, giving someone something from our bountiful supply, or getting a slightly different shade of clothing that we want, (but only because of the one we wanted is either out of stock, no longer available, or on backorder and we don't want to wait). The last one is also to an extent a forced sacrifice and not one we would choose if we had the better option.

It was a blessing that churches had technology to have services online when we weren't open during Covid-19. It was a blessing to keep connected via technology when we couldn't be together in person. Not as good in many ways (though some like the convenience of it and other things) It is a blessing to reach shut-ins and people traveling who are not able to go to church either online, DVDS, radio, TV etc. But, some of these blessing have also had some bad results. I have read about, and even know someone who attends another church, who has found the online services to be a good reason to stay at home in their pajamas instead of making the sacrifice of going to the church that they faithfully attended prior. Churches, however, usually cannot do their mission or even survive without people faithfully serving, supporting, attending in person etc. We have many here who serve week after week, and others who fill in needed gaps on the rare week those people are not here. It would be difficult to do church without them. The off site viewing of the services would be no more, or lesser quality (with things such as the camera not moving or zooming in, no slides for people at home to see etc.)

I also saw someone online whom I have never met recently write that that they can worship just fine themselves at home, they don't NEED a church. I interjected something to the effect of "it's also possible to live in another state than your spouse, and only see them online, but I don't recommend it". I understand it isn't a perfect analogy. We can worship God and spend time with Him anywhere and anytime in or out of a church building. But, Christianity is more than about us. Our purpose is more than being a spectator of a service, or participating on our own. It is more than the service being programmed to our liking. It is even more than worshipping God. It is encouraging one another when the other has fallen, is down, lacks faith, needs a hug, needs help, needs a sympathetic ear, or needs a body united in prayer. Sometimes we are the giver, and sometimes receiver. Sometimes we may be both. In-person church is also being a witness and example to others. I still remember people in the pews who were great examples to me as a kid, and there are still some now. I don't think that seeing services online would have had the same impact on me. I am not going to name people. I will however quote something Buck Percifield said a few years back as to why he attended church even when his illness and / or medication caused him to sleep here at times. He wanted people to know whose side he was on. Just the act of coming here was a statement and likely a witness. People are watching, neighbors at home or church may see us dressing up and going to church every week. Many of the lost will not likely look for our online service to watch ,but they may one day finally set foot in the building themselves when they find their lives in a mess or are looking for answers if they see people coming and going

The church has lost its standing and place in society. Reasons may include: poor behavior and witness from those under the name Christian, being wrapped up in our own interests, prioritizing other activities and things to church (if not also God Himself), and most certainly the devil. Church just doesn't hold the priority it once did (even with saved people), and I can't help but think we have seen the results in society. Churches are closing down, the percentage of people who are believers is dwindling, and many people have no interest in God or anything about Him.

I heard a statistic that I have mentioned before which said that people who only attended 1 Sunday out of six considered themselves to be active church goers. A quote from a song that I believe I have mentioned before, comes to mind again. "What kind of church would my church be, if every member were just like me?" I am certainly not picking on anyone, and actually didn't "plan" this article to go quite the direction it has. I even removed some things because of length. Sometimes things I type or read step on my toes too and I have pretty big feet.

"August is like the Sunday of summer," an online meme proclaims. But that means different things to different people.


